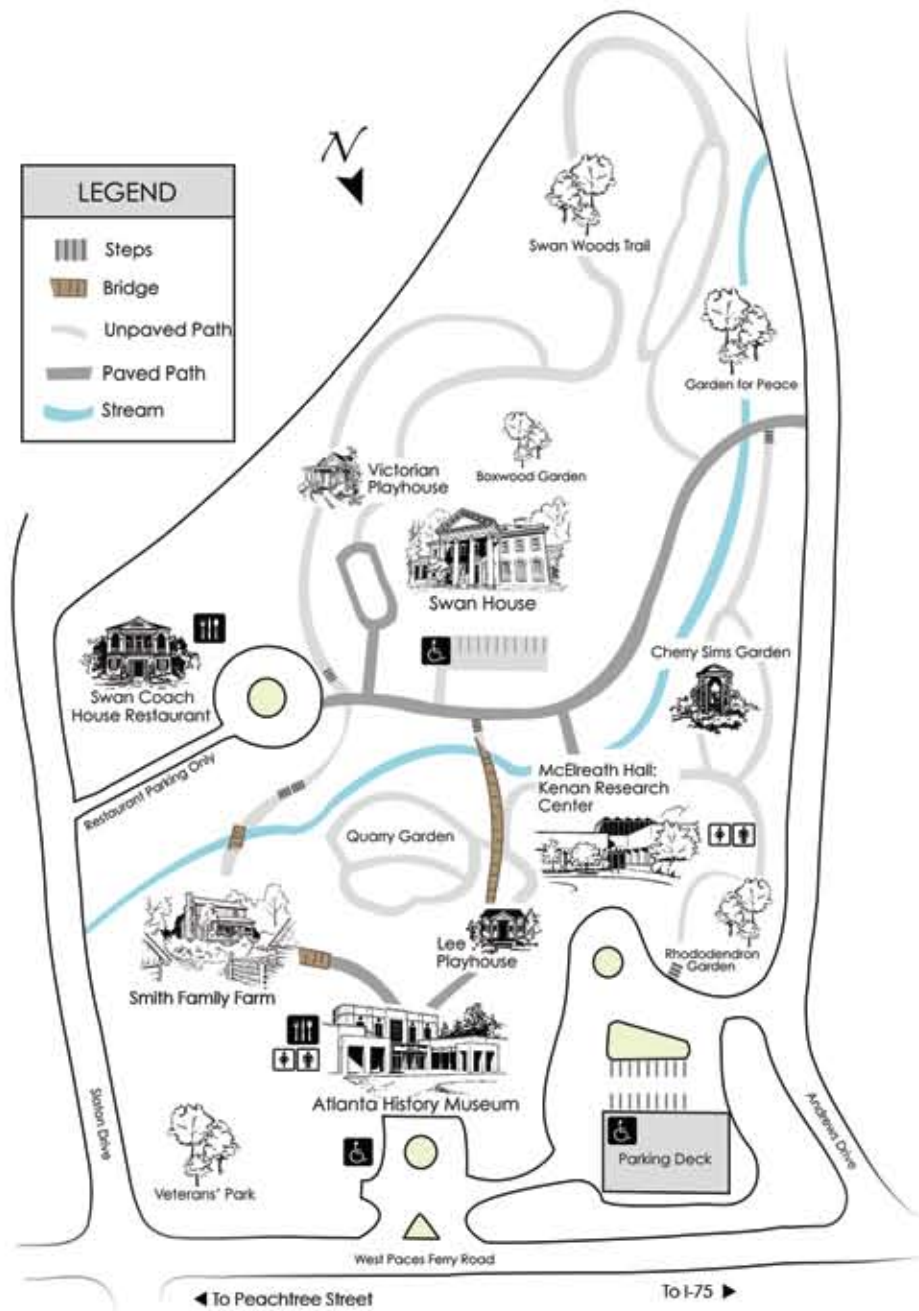

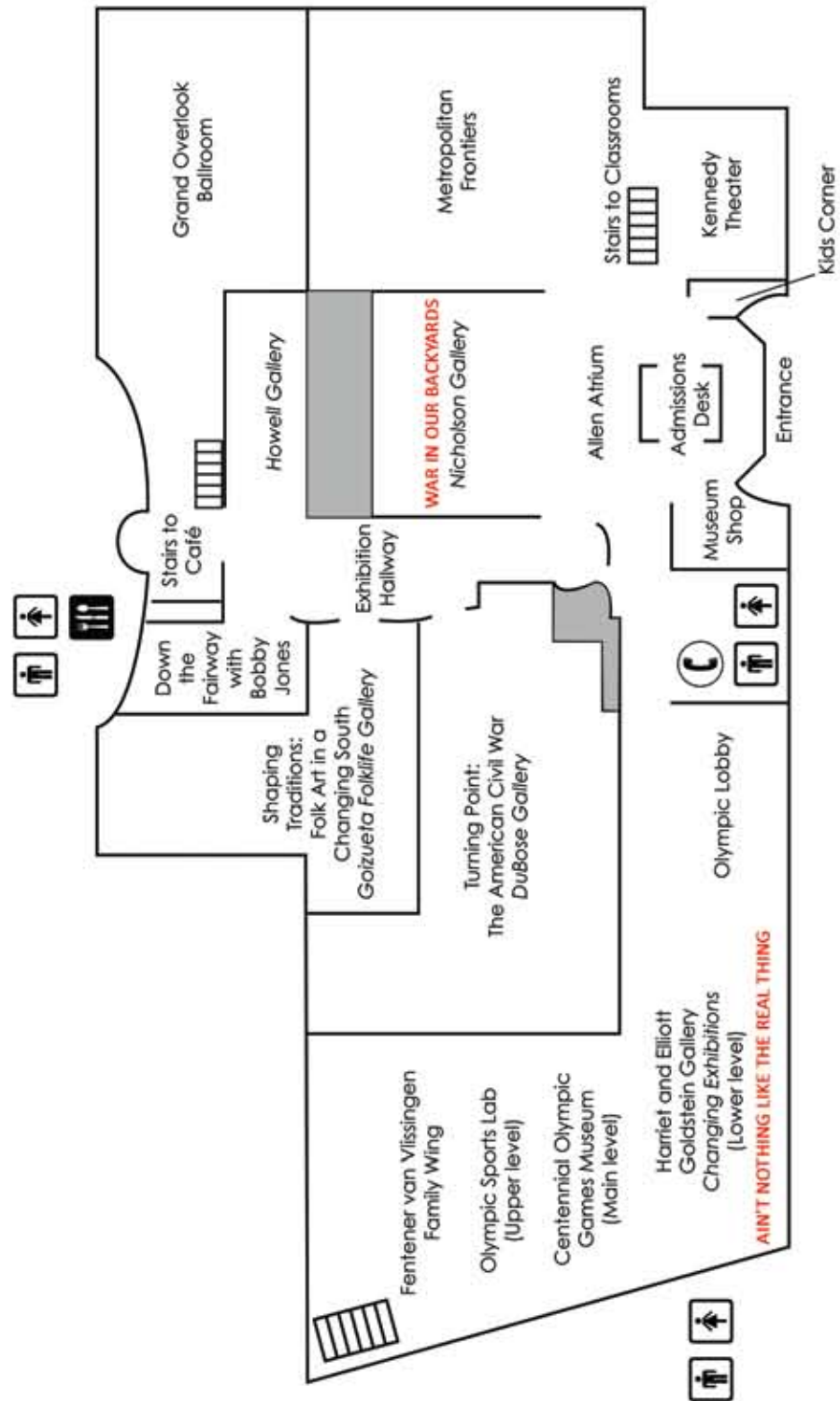

# SIGNATURE EXHIBITIONS



**Turning Point: The American Civil War**  
Explore one of the largest Civil War exhibitions in the nation. Learn the story of this monumental event through more than 1,400 original Union and Confederate artifacts, photographs, dioramas, videos, and interactive components. Free audio tours are available at the admissions desk. *DuBose Gallery*



**Metropolitan Frontiers**  
From Indian settlements to the Civil War and the Civil Rights Movement, explore Atlanta's fascinating story through rare objects, photographs, antique clothing, videos, and hands-on displays.



**Shaping Traditions: Folk Arts in a Changing South**  
Immerse yourself in southern folk culture through antique and contemporary objects, including pottery, weavings, quilts, furniture, ironwork, and musical instruments. *Goizueta Folklife Gallery*



**Centennial Olympic Games Museum**  
Enjoy a spectacular collection of multimedia presentations, artifacts, images, interactive displays, and a second level dedicated to a hands-on Sports Lab. The museum houses one of the most significant exhibitions on Olympic sports and history in the world. *Fentener van Vlissingen Family Wing*



**Down the Fairway with Bobby Jones**  
Discover rare artifacts, photographs, golf equipment, trophies, and more, all chronicling the life of this legendary golfer. Learn more about the history of the game and Georgia's contributions to the sport.



**Philip Trammell Shutze: Atlanta Classicist, Connoisseur, and Collector**  
Philip Trammell Shutze was a renowned architect and designer of the Swan House. Explore his personal collection of decorative arts and furniture from the seventeenth to the nineteenth century, on display in basement of Swan House. *Entrance to exhibit only available upon request following your Swan House tour.*

# HISTORIC HOUSES



**Swan House**  
Known as one of the most photographed places in Atlanta, Swan House is an elegant, classically styled mansion built in 1928 by distinguished Atlanta architect Philip Trammell Shutze. Designed for Edward and Emily Inman, the restored mansion offers a fascinating glimpse of an affluent lifestyle in early twentieth-century Atlanta. *Please see the admissions desk to schedule a tour.*



**Smith Family Farm**  
Smith Family Farm brings surroundings and culture from the mid-nineteenth century to life. Join costumed docents for a tour of the restored farmhouse and outbuildings including an open-hearth kitchen, blacksmith shop, smokehouse, double corncrib, and cabin. *Please see the admissions desk to schedule a tour.*

# HISTORIC GARDENS



**Mary Howard Gilbert Memorial Quarry Garden**  
Showcases the state's most comprehensive collection of plants native to pre-colonial Georgia.



**Cherry Sims Asian-American Garden**  
Asian plants and their American counterparts create an exotic environment complete with a gazebo, Japanese maples, and hydrangeas.



**Frank A. Smith Rhododendron Garden**  
Azaleas and rhododendrons are featured in this contemporary garden.

**Smith Family Farm Gardens**  
Versatile gardens represent what Georgians would have maintained for pleasure and utility in the 1860s.

**Swan House Gardens and Grounds**  
Enjoy the lavish landscape of Swan House featuring a boxwood garden and a cascading fountain.

**Swan Woods Trail**  
Explore the Georgia Piedmont's woodlands ecosystem and visit the Garden for Peace, an international gardens network dedicated to promoting peace.

**Connor Brown Discovery Trail**  
Young visitors can explore the History Center's campus in a voyage of discovery. Interactive stations encourage children to play, explore, imagine, and ask questions about the natural world around them. Discovery Trail guide books are available at the admissions desk.
