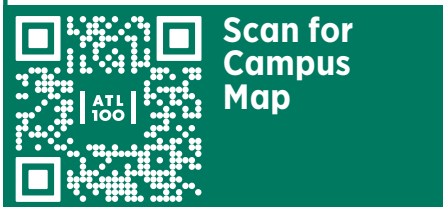
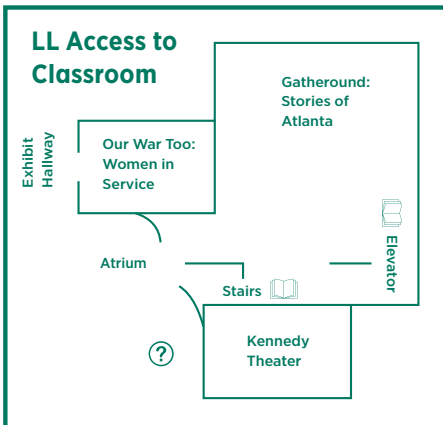
The Lost Colony Case
